Epiphany and Sticky Notes



I use sticky notes (Post-it notes) all the time! Remember this appointment...don't forget to check your calendar...make a phone call to that person...I must be

available at this time, etc.

Then, there are those things we all forget and need reminders. Where did I put my keys...where did I put my glasses (sometimes on my head!)...I walk into a room and blank on why I came into the room and stand there trying to remember the reason. I have left home for church, and forgotten keys, lunch, or some special item I wanted for the day and left it on the kitchen counter. I know you have all been there and done that! Depending on how busy or distracted your mind is and maybe running late and you have jumped ahead mentally, leaving behind the moment needed. I always keep a note pad by my bed to write down things I want to remember, for I know soon, I will be saying, "what was it I wanted to remember?!"

This may seem a strange way to start my newsletter article, but I wanted also to remind you of Epiphany. A time to remember the reason Jesus was born

unto us. Epiphany means manifestation or realization or new meaning for something. In this case Epiphany is a time we begin to understand God's love born unto us and how this gift changes how we live and remember each day. Each week until Lent we hear stories of how grace, forgiveness and faith should be made real in our lives because of Jesus.

Too often our mental "sticky notes" are only about what I don't want to forget day to day. We miss how God is trying to get our attention to make a difference in how we should live every

Do you remember the story of the boy Samuel? Chapter 3 of 1st Samuel. Samuel, a boy under the high priest Eli was sleeping and then the Lord called, "Samuel! Samuel!" and he ran to Eli thinking it was him. It took several times before Eli realized that God was calling Samuel and told the boy to say: "speak, for your servant is listening.

You are also a child of God and God continues to speak to you as well. So, I have a challenge for you during this Epiphany season! Take those sticky notes (Post-it notes) and put them around your house with these phrases: 1. Speak Lord for your servant is listening. 2. Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path. 3. The Lord is my shepherd, I

shall not want, he makes me to lie down in green pastures. 4. God is my refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. 5. Cast your burden on the Lord, and he will sustain you. 6. O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his steadfast love endures forever! 7. I lift up my eyes to the hills – My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth. 8. The Spirit helps us in our weakness, for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words.

Use your "Post-it notes" and stick those remembering phrases of God's presence around the house during Epiphany and maybe beyond. Yes, don't forget your glasses and daily needs along with your keys but also use these biblical phrases to bring comfort and remembrance, that every day the love of God is fulfilled for you in Jesus. And don't forget where you put them!

Valentines Day is coming on the 14th so don't forget those persons you love! Also, March 5th is the beginning of Lent with Ash Wednesday.
